<p>A Day in the Life...</p> <p>Create a time log showing how you use your day. Then create questions to answer from your time log. For example: "How much time passes between breakfast and dinner?" Answer your questions.</p>	<p>Read to Someone</p> <p>Practice reading aloud to a grown up or sibling to build your fluency skill. Be sure to pay attention to punctuation to help be more expressive and bring your reading to life!</p>	<p>Science Artist</p> <p>Create an art piece to show your biome. Do you want to draw it? Make a diorama? Write a song? Write a poem? Make a movie? What interests you?</p>
